

# DR .WAYNE FLYNT

on "Pulitzers and Politics: The Best and Worst of Alabama History"


The Friends of the Mobile Public Library are thrilled to be welcoming Dr. Wayne Flynt as the 2019 Annual Meeting speaker on Thursday, January 31 at the West Regional Library, 5555 Grelot Road. The reception begins at 5:30 with Dr. Flynt's remarks starting at 6:45.

Dr. Flynt, Professor Emeritus in the Department of History at Auburn, is an award-winning author of 13 books, and one of the most recognized and honored scholars of Southern history, politics, and religion.

He has also published his memoir **Keeping the Faith: Ordinary People**, Extraordinary Lives in which he writes about his experiences in the Civil Rights movement. The September 15, 1963 bombing of Birmingham's 16th Street Baptist Church was key in shaping Flynt's views on the movement, confirming for him that those against civil rights were wrong and those who supported the movement were right. Flynt notes that being seventy allowed him some freedom in writing. "I'm retired, I don't give a hoot what anybody thinks about me... nobody can get me fired because you can't fire someone from retirement."

A teacher, believes Flynt, is always a teacher, and can be a teacher in many different ways-through writing, lectures or through his or her memoir. It is Flynt's ultimate wish to leave a legacy. "I'd sort of like for somebody to believe... somehow Alabama's a little bit better because I was a teacher and wrote about what I experienced and how I changed."

Books for sale will include: Alabama: A Deep South State - Bicentennial Edition; Poor But Proud: Alabama's Poor Whites; Alabama in the Twentieth Century; Keeping the Faith: Ordinary People, Extraordinary Lives; Southern Religion & Christian Diversity in the Twentieth Century; and Mockingbird Songs: My Friendship with Harper Lee.

are coming to the library!




February 10 - March 27, 2019, the Ben May Main

## Restoring and Preserving Abandoned Cemeteries

Saturday, Nov. 3, 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Ben May Main Library & Oaklawn Cemetery

This two-part program about cemetery care is applicable to cemeteries in general, but a significant portion of the program focuses on the Oaklawn Cemetery in Mobile.

Speakers include Emily Ford, owner of the Oak & Laurel Cemetery Preservation, LLC, Eddie Irby, President of the 92nd Division Buffalo Soldiers of WWII, Tracy Neely, President of the Mobile Creole Cultural and Historical Preservation Society, and Lorenzo Martin, City of Prichard Councilman. There is no limit to attendance for this program. There will be a lunch break from 12 to 12:30 p.m.

The second part of the program is a two hour, hands-on workshop at Oaklawn Cemetery, restoring neglected gravesites, including re-setting headstones, proper headstone cleaning, and landscape maintenance. All materials will be provided. We will meet at Oaklawn at 2:30 p.m. Attendance for this portion is limited to 25 participants. ### Here are the rules/guidelines:

Open to all high school students (public, private and home schooled) grades 9-12.

Entries are invited in three categories-Poetry, Short Story, & Essay. Prizes will be awarded for first, second and third place in each category. Honorable mentions may also be awarded. Only one entry per category per student.

All entries must be typed. Each entry should have a title. Students should submit each entry under a pen name located on the title page.

A separate sheet containing the student's pen name, real name, phone number, high school, and English teacher's name should be stapled to the back of each entry.

Winners' submissions will be uploaded to the Friends of the Mobile Public Library website.

Length: Poems should be no longer than two pages; Essays should be between 500-2100 words; and Short Stories may be up to 15 pages (using 10 point type or larger).
